

Phase 2: Nearly finished

Our project started in August 2004. Now the circular path is complete. There are new entrance signs and steps. The unsightly structure at the Teviot road entrance has been replaced. There are bench seats for people to rest on. The wood feels lighter and safer now lots of vegetation has been cleared. More people visit the copse. The outdoor classroom area and the new gate into Moorlands School, help the school use the nature reserve throughout the year.

We are waiting for some way-mark signs to help people new to the woods feel more confident. There are a few more items; the project is nearly finished. Soon we have to tell the funders what we have done with their money.

Coppicing and clearing

In the summer the conservation volunteers, CROW, did lots of coppicing. The idea is to cut wood right back to encourage re-growth of hazel branches. They will coppice some of the hazel every year for seven years, returning to the beginning in the eighth year. The dead cuttings are left in place to protect the young growing branches from nibbling by deer.

CROW have also been clearing some of the invaders (laurel and ivy) that had been making the wood too dark.



Action Plan Sept 2005-2007

Copse users, people on the walks, CROW, RBC and Globe contributed to the plan for the woods. It lists tasks to be done, and people who have agreed to do them. Items include:

- encouraging wild flowers and British plants to grow in the woods. We have English bluebells and want to keep it that wayso we will try to eliminate the infiltrating Spanish bluebells in the spring.
- keeping a regular check every month or so on the paths
- passing on information about what people notice in the woods.
